General Debate

Mr. President,

My name is Dr. Manoharan.

On 2 January 2006 the Sri Lankan Special Task Forces (STF) murdered my beloved son Ragihar on a beach in Trincomalee.¹

Today, nine long years have passed since my son's murder with no justice from Sri Lankan courts.

My family and I had to leave the country as there is no adequate witness protection in the country.

I am thankful to the Human Rights Council for taking this first step towards to truth and justice with this comprehensive report. Our case, the Trinco 5 case, is featured in the OISL report.²

I beg you to make good on your promises to victims' families. Sri Lanka needs help from the international community.
