Police spokesman, DIG Ajith Rohana, on Saturday, told the PCoI probing the Easter S attacks that the power to issue detention orders for suspects arrested on terrorism-reactivities should be given to a DIG instead of a court of law. The representative of the Attorney General's Department that led the evidence asked what the most important aspects to be considered were when extending detention or terror suspects.

"Usually, we go before a Magistrate to get detention orders or to get an extension. My opinion is that a DIG must be given the power to extend detention orders. There is no with establishing a supervisory body to monitor this. A Magistrate who operates in an where terrorism or religious extremism is rife is somewhat unsafe. Pressure can be exthe Magistrate. The police spokesman added that authorising a DIG to extend detention orders would helpful to investigators.

Chairman of the PCoI then asked DIG Rohana for his proposals on granting bail for the arrested for terrorist activities. "I don't think such a person should be granted bail be year has elapsed.
